Reception Classes

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Self regulation understand their own feelings & others; work towards simple goals; follow instructions
- Managing self independence, resilience, perseverance; behave accordingly; manage basic hygiene
- Building relationships turn taking, play cooperatively; positive attachments with adults and friends; sensitive to own & others needs



Physical Development

- Gross motor skills negotiate space, awareness of themselves and others; strength, balance & coordination; moving energetically.
- Fine motor skills hold a pencil effectively tripod grip; use small tools e.g. scissors, cutlery; begin to show accuracy & care when drawing.





Communication and Language

- Listening, Attention and Understanding attentive listening in whole class discussions & small group – responding accordingly; ask questions to clarify understanding; hold conversations.
 - **Speaking –** small group, class & one-to-one discussions; offer explanations of why things may happen & use new vocabulary; talk about own experiences using past, present & future tenses & make use of conjunctions



Literacy

- Comprehension show understanding of stories, non-fiction & rhymes. Use new vocabulary correctly.
- Word reading recognise all letter sounds & 10 digraphs (special friends). Use phonic knowledge to read words & sentences including common exception words (red words).
- Writing form letters correctly, use phonic knowledge to spell words & simple sentences that can be read by others.

Mathematical Development

- Number a deep understanding of numbers to 10; subitise up to 5 (recognise quantities without counting); automatic recall of number bonds to 5, some number bonds to 10, including double facts.
- Numerical patterns verbally count beyond 20; compare quantities to 10 – greater than, less than or the same as; explore patterns within numbers up to 10 – evens, odds, doubles & the same as.





Understanding the World

- Past & present talk about people around them; similarities & differences in the past & now; understand the past through books and storytelling
- People, Culture & Communities describe their environment; similarities & differences between religious and cultural communities in this country; and in life in this country and life in other countries.
- Natural World explore the natural world around them; similarities & differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments.



Expressive Arts and Design

- Creating with materials safely use a variety of materials, tools & techniques; share their creations – explain the process; use props and materials in role play.
- Being imaginative & expressive invent, adapt & recount narratives; sing a range of nursery rhymes & songs; perform songs, stories, rhymes & move in time with music.



Baseline Assessment

- ◇ In the first 6 weeks of Reception:
- Children will be assessed on:

Early number, addition & subtraction, mathematical language, early understanding of pattern, early vocabulary, phonological awareness (letter sounds), early comprehension.

- ♦ This will be task based using resources.
- ♦ Measures will be published when chn are in Year 6

A typical day in Reception ...

- 8.45 children are collected from Early Years gate, they come in cloakroom door then register.
- > 9.00-9.30 Read, Write, Inc sessions
- 9.30 carpet teaching session
- 9.50–10.20 Focused literacy / maths activities both indoors & outdoors enhanced provision linked to literacy / maths and cross-curricular. Snack time.
- ♦ 1 morning a week Physical Development session.
- > 10.20-10:30 Maths carpet session
- ◇ 10.30-11.25 Focused literacy / maths activities both indoors & outdoors enhanced provision linked to literacy / maths and cross-curricular.
- 11.25–11.45 tidy up time & carpet time
- > 11.45-12.45 Lunch and outdoor play
- 12.45-1.00 handwriting session
- 1.00-2.50 PSE, Understanding the World, Expressive Arts & Design linked to particular themes - indoor & outdoor
- ◊ 2.50-3:10 tidy up time, Story/singing/circle time
- 3.20 Home time collected from classroom doors.



Topics we teach in Reception

Autumn 1 – All About Me (what makes us special and the senses)

Autumn 2 – Dinosaurs

Spring 1 – Wild World

Spring 2 – You Are What You Eat

Summer 1 – Once Upon a Time

Summer 2 – Minibeasts

We introduce a new word of the week every week, which links to the topic we are teaching.

The first half term in Reception

- ♦ Daily phonics lessons starting from next week.
- ♦ Daily maths and literacy lessons.
- PE every Wednesday (ball skills and movement)
- ♦ Forest school on a Friday.

What can YOU do to support your child in Reception?

Literacy, Communication and Language & Physical Development:

- Regular conversations about their day, stories, etc
- Personal hygiene eg toilet independence, coat on & off & zip, regularly cleaning teeth & hand washing
- Vsing cutlery at mealtimes
- Begin to learn Read Write Inc letter sounds
- Play 'I Spy...' initial sound recognition
- Regularly share books together follow words with finger
- Ongoing-encourage mark making, writing name
- ♦ Letter formation sheets in pack. Tripod grip.

What can you can do to support your child in Reception?

Maths and Number:

- Numbers to learn 1 to 10 e.g. use foam numbers for bath
- Practise counting at any time-climbing the stairs, shopping etc.
- Play simple board games
- Sing number rhymes and songs together
- Notice numbers in the environment
- Explore and name 2D shapes while building, etc.

Other matters...

- ◆If someone else is collecting your child you need to inform the office or the class teacher.
- ◆If late coming to school (gate is closed need to drop child off at main entrance)
- Seesaw will be used to share information, homework, photos of the children learning, etc
- Newsletters & Knowledge Organisers are sent on Seesaw every half term highlighting what your child will be learning and the theme. These are also on our website.
