Year One

Literacy

Our texts this half term will be The Tiger who came to Tea and Where the Wild Things are.

The children will:

- Sequence the stories and write about different characters in the stories.
- Complete non-fiction writing, focussing on tigers.
- Complete non-fiction writing through topic work on Pirates.
- Continue to re-enforce and apply word/sentence level skills.
- Through a variety of reading styles e.g. shared reading/guided reading/individual reading continue practising and reinforcing their skills.

Numeracy

- Develop understanding of numbers up to 20 and beyond.
- Identifying whether a number is less than or more than a given number.
- Count in multiples using the x 2/x5/x 10 tables.
- To solve problems using addition, subtraction, doubling and halving.
- Count and apply skills on the 100 square, adding 10 and multiples of 10.
- Looking at shapes and observing their features.
- · Sorting shapes into specific groups.
- Looking at position and direction and following instructions on a map linking to topic.
- Telling the time, using O clock and half past.

Topic -Pirates

Look at the Golden Age of Piracy.

- Look at where Pirates came from, identifying countries, seas and continents using a globe.
- Design and create own Pirate flags.
- Write our own Code of Conduct based on Pirate codes of Conduct..
- Listen to Pirate stories and poetry.
- Make a range of Pirate themed accessories such as hats and telescopes.
- Complete pirate themed investigations looking at the properties of materials.

ICT

- Be able to log on to specific programmes used in school, and use the software available on these packages.
- Continue to develop and extend coding skills with year 4 buddies.

PSHCE

The children are following a scheme called Zippy and his friends and the modules will be looking at:

Saying Goodbye, where the children will be looking at change in their lives and loss.
