


English Knowledge Organiser- Magazine article-Year 3 Climate Action

VOCABULARY
A word which refers to a person, place or a thing.
Expanded noun phrases add more detail to the noun by adding one or more adjectives.
A word which describes a noun.
A word which connects words, phrases or clauses, for example but.
A word or phrase placed at the beginning of a sentence which are used to describe the action that follows.
A word or phrase which describes when an action takes place, i.e. in the blink of an eye.
A simile describing one thing by comparing it to another using 'as' or like'. For example, minds are lie computers.
A question asked in order to create a dramatic effect or to make a point rather than to get an answer.
Describing objects as if they are people is a way of making sentences more exciting. For example, Jess's heart is racing at 100 miles per hour.
