LITERACY

Non Fiction/Fiction - The Romans

NUMERACY

Securing knowledge of all times tables up to 12x12

Continue to revise formal written methods of calculation - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division using these within number problems

Read and understand Roman numerals

Compare and classify geometric shapes, including quadrilaterals and triangles, based on their properties and sizes

Identify acute and obtuse angles and compare and order angles up to two right angles by size

Identify lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes presented in different orientations

Find the perimeter and area of shapes

Design, write and debug programs using hopscotch and purple mash code programming resources

Use the internet to support learning in numeracy and topic lessons.

THE ROMANS

Enhance our topic on The Romans by visiting the Roman fort of Segedunum in Wallsend, Newcastle.

Carry out workshops on life as a Roman soldier in the fort and experience how the fort would have looked in Roman times. In school find out about the location of Rome, how it got its name.

Explore Roman soldiers - What armour and weapons did they have? How well trained were they?

Find out when the Romans arrived in Britain. Why did they invade? Find out about Hadrian and why he built his wall? Find out about Gladiators, Amphitheatres and Roman baths. Complete homework based on The Romans.
