Nursery

Year 2

Year 2 have had a lovely time in November. We have been enjoying our outdoor learning looking creating fireworks and learning more about The Great Fire of Gateshead. We also visited the Discovery Museum, where we explored different Victorian items. In Maths, we have been developing our addition and subtraction skills by using base 10.

Year 3

In Year 3, we have been conducting many practical experiments in science. This has encouraged the children to work scientifically and apply an enquiring mind throughout their Science lessons. We have also been enjoying dance during PE, and made rubbings (frottage)













Year 4

In Year 4 this term, we've been busy exploring exciting new skills across different subjects! We had the incredible opportunity to join a virtual live talk with the famous author Jacqueline Wilson, where we learned valuable tips for writing a letter to an author, improving our English writing. In Art, we've been experimenting with watercolours, learning various techniques to create shades and tints, which help make our paintings look more realistic. We've focused on drawing and painting real-life objects, like fruit, and are now preparing for a still life composition painting, where we'll apply everything we've learned to create our own beautiful artwork!

Class 11 also took part in Bikeability sessions, where we developed key cycling skills, including road safety and control, building confidence on two wheels. We're excited to share that Bikeability will continue in the new year with Class 10!
