

English Knowledge Organiser- Narrative -Year 3 Autumn 1

KEY	VOCABULARY
Noun	A word which refers to a person, place or a thing.
Collective noun	A word which refers to a group of something, for example flock, society, pod or fleet.
Adjective	A word which describes a noun.
Conjunction	A word which connects words, phrases or clauses, for example but.
Adverb	A word which describes a verb. For example, The girl ran quickly .
Time adverbial	A word or phrase which describes when an action takes place, i.e. in the blink of an eye.
Simile	A simile describing one thing by comparing it to another using 'as' or like'. For example, minds are lie computers.
Synonym	A word that has a similar meaning as another, i.e. intelligent and clever.

Learning Intention

Children will explore the narrative structure in this unit. The story 'The Secret of Black' will form the basis of their exploration. Children will develop their understanding of different parts of speech to construct and develop complex sentences. They will also learn writing techniques to develop their writing.



Key Outcomes

- Use time adverbials to develop sentences.
- Understand when to use similes and how these can be used to enrich a text in a creative and compelling manner.
- Include dialogue into a story to increase variety.
